// EXECUTIVE SUMMARY //

The following items represent developments of interest during the preceding reporting window. All sources are open press; all assessments are derived solely from publicly available reporting. Items are grouped by region and operational relevance. Reader discretion advised.

ITEM 01 DOMESTIC · POLITICAL VIOLENCE

TRUMP SURVIVES THIRD ASSASSINATION ATTEMPT

KEY JUDGMENT – A gunman breached the security perimeter at the White House Correspondents' Dinner at the Washington Hilton on 25 APR, opening fire near the lobby screening area. Secret Service evacuated President Trump, VP Vance, FLOTUS Melania Trump, and Cabinet officials. Suspect Cole Tomas Allen, 31, of California – with no prior radical footprint – was apprehended and charged 27 APR with attempted assassination of a U.S. president. Per CSIS, attacks against government officials reached a 30-year high in 2025, with 20+ incidents against Trump administration figures alone.

SELECTUSA SUMMIT SPOTLIGHTS AFRICAN INVESTMENT UNDER TRAVEL BAN

KEY JUDGMENT – The U.S. Commerce Department's annual SelectUSA Investment Summit opened 4 MAY in National Harbor, Maryland, with rare focus on African direct investment in the United States. South Africa leads with \$5.4B in U.S. equity and net loans despite diplomatic tensions; Tunisia (\$54M), Egypt (\$41M), Liberia (\$23M), and Kenya (\$6M) follow. Critically, 30 African countries now face Trump-imposed visa bonds and 12 are subject to outright travel bans – restrictions that directly hamper potential business partners. China simultaneously assumed UN Security Council presidency this month, naming "stability and development of African countries" its third priority.

HURRICANE MELISSA AFTERMATH: NEW SEASON LOOMS

KEY JUDGMENT – Communities in western Jamaica continue to absorb the long-tail effects of October 2025's Category 5 Hurricane Melissa as the 2026 hurricane season opens in weeks. Residents of John's Hall, St James report repeat flooding from rivers that previously never breached homes – a structural shift in flood vulnerability now driving emergency desilting projects and lobbying for retaining walls. The controversial National Reconstruction and Resilience Authority (NaARRA) Bill is currently before the Jamaican Senate. The Bank of Jamaica fixed the USD at J\$158.13 on 4 MAY.

DIASPORA · BROOKLYN

HAITIAN HERITAGE MONTH ANCHORED IN VODOU, SOUND, HEALING

KEY JUDGMENT – Atelier Artist, a BIPOC-owned creative co-working studio in Central Brooklyn, launched its first monthlong artist residency on 1 MAY featuring Haitian American interdisciplinary artist Riva Nyri Précil. Programming includes an artist talk, intimate concert, a sound bath drawn from Vodou practices, and a traditional herbal tea gathering on Haitian healing knowledge – closing with a Fèt Kouzen celebration on 24 MAY. The residency centers Haitian spirituality, culture, and community as foundational to Brooklyn's creative ecosystem during Haitian Heritage Month.

MAY DAY: 5,000+ ACTIONS, "NO SCHOOL, NO WORK, NO SHOPPING"

KEY JUDGMENT – The May Day Strong coalition of hundreds of labor organizations led an economic blackout on 1 MAY, with millions of workers, students, and families participating in 5,000+ actions nationwide. In New York, Mayor Zohran Mamdani became the first NYC mayor to address a May Day rally since Fiorello La Guardia nearly a century ago, joining SEIU Local 32BJ workers demanding union rights, higher wages, progressive taxation, and immigrant protections. Mamdani separately demanded King Charles III "return the Koh-i-Noor Diamond" during a recent visit.

TRUMP EXPANDS SANCTIONS; FUEL BLOCKADE ROILS ECONOMY

KEY JUDGMENT – The administration has expanded sanctions against Cuba's government as a U.S. fuel blockade compounds the island's economic crisis. A Cuban immigrant died in a Georgia ICE jail this week – the 18th such death in 2026. Separately, RSF's 2026 World Press Freedom Index reports global press freedom at a 25-year low; the U.S. fell seven places to 64th. The Israeli army has killed 220+ journalists in Gaza since October 2023, making it the world's largest killer of journalists.
